The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Department of Public Safety, Division of Adult Corrections and Juvenile Justice, Juvenile Community Programs section in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year 2019-2020 beginning on, or after, July 1, 2019. The use of these funds in this county requires a local match in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the services listed below. Two or more services listed indicated a tie in the ranking process.

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Youth who have prior referrals to Juvenile Court, substance use or abuse, have moderate or serious school behavior problems, are rejected by pro-social peers, and sometimes associate with delinquent youth.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

- Peer Domain: Youth who lack pro-social peer groups and sometimes associate with delinquent youth.
- Individual Domain: Youth who have some substance use or abuse and have mental health needs being met or that need further assessment.
- Family Domain: Youth who have family members who have prior or current involvement in the criminal justice system.
- School Domain: Youth who have moderate or serious school behavior issues that include unexcused absences, in school suspension and multiple short term suspensions.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individual, if applicable.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
